

Read the history of Groundhog Day and find the words in ***bold italics***.

A fun day to celebrate in February is ***Groundhog*** Day. This ***holiday*** dates back a long time and has gone through many changes, but today it revolves around the ***weather***. Every year on ***February*** 2, many cities hold big celebrations. The most famous is in Punxsutawney, ***Pennsylvania***. During this event they pull a groundhog (also known as a ***whistlepig***) out of his burrow. If he sees his ***shadow***, then the ***folklore*** says that there will be six more weeks of ***winter***. However, if it is overcast (and he doesn't see his shadow) then ***spring*** is on its way!
